Dear Mr. Byron:

The Select Subcommittee to Investigate the Remaining Questions Surrounding January 6, 2021, is conducting oversight of the events that occurred at the Capitol and the response and subsequent investigation. Last Congress, the House Administration Subcommittee on Oversight successfully highlighted security failures that the House Select Committee to Investigate the January 6th Attack on the United States Capitol (January 6th Select Committee) failed to investigate.¹ The House Administration Oversight Subcommittee also found that the January 6th Select Committee failed to archive certain video footage and that many documents were missing or deleted.²

This Congress, the Select Subcommittee has continued its vigorous oversight of the agencies that responded to the events of January 6, ensuring that the unresolved questions are answered, that federal agencies are faithfully servicing the American people, and that the United States Capitol Complex is secure. To assist in our oversight, we respectfully request that you produce the following documents and information:

1. All records that refer or relate to investigations into the events at or near the Capitol on January 6, 2021, including but not limited to records from the Select Committee to Investigate the January 6th Attack on the United States Capitol, the Department of Justice and its component parts, the Department of the Interior, the Executive Office of the President, the Department of Homeland Security, the Central Intelligence Agency, the Office of the Director of National Intelligence, the National Security Agency, and the Department of the Treasury for the period January 6, 2021, to the present.



H. Res. 605 authorized the Select Subcommittee “to conduct a full and complete investigation and study and issue a final report of the events surrounding January 6, 2021 regarding matters within the jurisdiction of the Committee on the Judiciary under clause 1(l) of rule X of the Rules of the House of Representatives.”³ Pursuant to the Rules of the House of Representatives, the Committee on the Judiciary has legislative and oversight jurisdiction over federal law enforcement.⁴
