Dear Secretary Burgum:

The Select Subcommittee to Investigate the Remaining Questions Surrounding January 6, 2021 (Select Subcommittee) is conducting oversight of the events that occurred at the Capitol and the response and subsequent investigation. Last Congress, the House Administration Subcommittee on Oversight successfully highlighted security failures that the House Select Committee to Investigate the January 6th Attack on the United States Capitol (January 6th Select Committee) failed to investigate.¹ The House Administration Oversight Subcommittee also found that the January 6th Select Committee failed to archive certain video footage and that many documents were missing or deleted.²

This Congress, the Select Subcommittee will continue its vigorous oversight of the agencies that responded to the events of January 6, ensuring that the unresolved questions are answered, that federal agencies are faithfully serving the American people, and that the United States Capitol Complex is secure. To assist in our oversight, we respectfully request that you produce to the Select Subcommittee all materials provided by the Department of the Interior (DOI) to the January 6th Select Committee in the 117th Congress, including all documents and communications between or among the January 6th Select Committee and DOI.

Please provide this material as soon as possible but no later than 5:00 p.m. ten business days following reinstatement of appropriations. H. Res. 605 authorized the Select Subcommittee “to conduct a full and complete investigation and study and issue a final report of the events surrounding January 6, 2021 regarding matters within the jurisdiction of the Committee on the Judiciary under clause 1(l) of rule X of the Rules of the House of Representatives.”³ Pursuant to


