Dear Secretary Bessent:

The Select Subcommittee to Investigate the Remaining Questions Surrounding January 6, 2021 (Select Subcommittee) is conducting oversight of the events that occurred at the Capitol and the response and subsequent investigation. Last Congress, the House Administration Subcommittee on Oversight successfully highlighted security failures that the House Select Committee to Investigate the January 6th Attack on the United States Capitol (January 6th Select Committee) failed to investigate.<sup>1</sup> The House Administration Oversight Subcommittee also found that the January 6th Select Committee failed to archive certain video footage and that many documents were missing or deleted.<sup>2</sup>

This Congress, the Select Subcommittee will continue its vigorous oversight of the agencies that responded to the events of January 6, ensuring that the unresolved questions are answered, that federal agencies are faithfully serving the American people, and that the United States Capitol Complex is secure. Last Congress, the Department of Treasury (Treasury) informed Chairman Loudermilk, in a letter dated July 16, 2024, enclosed, that provisions had been made for the January 6th Select Committee to conduct an *in camera* review of documents relevant to its investigation.<sup>3</sup> To assist in our oversight, we respectfully request that you arrange for the Select Subcommittee to conduct its own *in camera* review of all materials provided by Treasury to the January 6th Select Committee in the 117th Congress.

Please provide this material as soon as possible but no later than 5:00 p.m. ten business days following reinstatement of appropriations. H. Res. 605 authorized the Select Subcommittee


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“to conduct a full and complete investigation and study and issue a final report of the events surrounding January 6, 2021 regarding matters within the jurisdiction of the Committee on the Judiciary under clause 1(l) of rule X of the Rules of the House of Representatives.”<sup>4</sup> Pursuant to the Rules of the House of Representatives, the Committee on the Judiciary has legislative and oversight jurisdiction over federal law enforcement.<sup>5</sup>

Dear Chairman Loudermilk,

I write in response to your letter dated June 18, 2024, concerning records produced by the Department of the Treasury to the Select Committee to Investigate the January 6<sup>th</sup> Attack on the United States Capitol (Select Committee).

During the prior Congress, the Department made certain law enforcement-sensitive records that are protected by law available to the Select Committee for review *in camera*, in a controlled reading room, consistent with the Select Committee's legislative purpose and to accommodate its legitimate oversight needs. These records remained in the custody and control of the Department at all times and Select Committee staff were not permitted to make or retain copies of these records. To the best of our knowledge, no Departmental records were produced into the custody and control of the Select Committee.
